


What is "Family Ministry?"


An intentional partnership between church and home designed to teach kids, equip parents, and develop leaders, in order to impact generations, one home at a time.

Biblical Basis for Family Ministry for Parents


Deut 6: 5-9: Role of the Parent is described

Command: "Listen, Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength. These words that I am giving you today are to be in your heart. Repeat them to your children"

Description: "Talk about them when you sit in your house and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up. Bind them as a sign on your hand and let them be a symbol on your forehead. Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your city gates."

(Parent Focused)

Pro's

•Kids and parents are always experiencing same environment and same content making it easier for "one conversation" at home.

Con's

- •Kids lack content that is created for them and communicated in a way that they can learn on their level.
- •Partnership with church is environmental instead of training and equipping.

Family Ministry Models

Pro's

- •Efforts may generate excitement and attendance.
- •Allows for individual creativity in ministries.

Con's

- •Danger of church becoming "primary discipling" vehicle.
- •Lack of strategy or partnership between ministries.
- •Creates competition between ministries.
- •Destroys sense of team among ministries.

Pro's

- •Promotes partnerships of church and home AND partnership of individual ministries.
- •Allows for church staff to work towards same goal

Con's

- Difficult to Implement and sustain.
- Needs "buy In" from leadership, staff, families, and volunteers
